


Dish - With Esterházy pattern

The bowl has the shape of a spherical segment it stands on a short, plain, rounded foot. It is decorated with the so-called *Esterházy pattern*, which originates from Chinese porcelain-making: a blossoming stem among a few grass leaves. The outside of the rim is painted in white against a red base, while the surface is decorated with red against white. The centre shows a smaller motif, surrounded with two rows of alternating small and large patterns. The other element of the *Esterházy pattern*, the two lines of vertical Chinese writing, is missing from this decoration (see Inv.No. 51.1374.2.1).
