A large, heavy stamp ring for a man. The whole surface is covered with leaved foliage. The top shows a soldered escutcheon, enclosed by tiny gold nuggets. The head can be opened, concealing a compartment in a square-shaped hole, which is covered by the folding, empty rim. The compartment is divided into four small parts, with engraved inscriptions on the rim *BALLAARAT BENDIGO, OVENS, JIM CROW*. Ballarat and Bendigo are towns in Australia, famous for their gold mines the other two names probably refer to the gold diggers.
